**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
NO. 00-08-A2**

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida, and the Clerk of the Circuit and County Courts and of the Board of County Commissioners have undertaken an Optical Imaging Project designed to introduce this new technology into the Traffic Section of the County Court; and

WHEREAS, the Optical Imaging Project continues to require an effective policy-making mechanism to, upon appropriate consultation with the Chief Judge, resolve key issues of organization, planning, technology application and legality arising in the course of the Project; and

WHEREAS, implementation of an Optical Imaging Project in the Traffic Section realizes significant efficiencies and economies within the Traffic Section's operations which could justify its implementation in other areas of the Court System, thereby yielding further efficiencies and economies within the Court System;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida under Rule 2.050 of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, I hereby appoint or reappoint the following individuals as members of the Optical Imaging Executive Policy Committee ("Committee"):

It is hereby further ordered, that following consultation with the Chief Judge with respect to all substantive policy and related issues, the Committee shall continue to establish policy and resolve all issues arising during the course of implementation of an Optical Imaging Project in the Traffic Section of the Court. Committee action shall continue to be determined by majority vote. Issues to be addressed by the Committee include, but are not limited to, issues relating to organization, planning, personnel, application of imaging technology, legality of the use of optical imaging in the State Court System, content of any Request for Proposal, vendor selection, and operational issues arising during implementation of the Optical Imaging Project, including the use of consultants. The Committee shall continue, on a priority basis, to identify those statutory and rule changes necessary to implement optical imaging in the State Court System and shall ascertain the feasibility of timely accomplishing such changes.

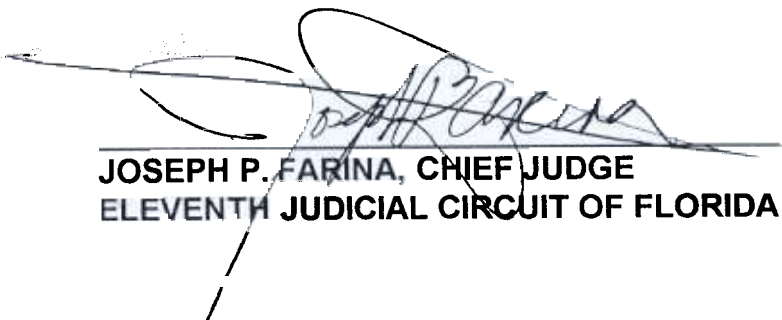
Further, the Committee is hereby authorized to designate appropriate working groups of subcommittees and each subcommittee shall have specifically identified tasks.

The Committee shall meet at times and places designated by its Co-Chairs. Support services shall be provided by the Administrative Office of the Courts.

The Clerk shall file a copy of this Administrative Order in Case No. 97-1 (Court Administration).

This Administrative Order shall be effective upon signing. All provisions of Administrative Order No. 00-8 and No. 00-8A1, that are not in conflict with this order are retained and remain in full force and effect.
