ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
NO. 80-25

PURSUANT TO the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida, the following procedures shall be adhered to in handling emergency matters and the emergency assignment of cases in the Family Juvenile Department of the Family Division of the Circuit Court:

1. Urgent matters, cognizable only in the Family Juvenile Department of the Family Division, that arise after five o'clock P.M. daily, or on week-ends, may be presented to the Emergency Judge of the Family Juvenile Department of the Family Division whose name is listed in the Miami Review and Daily Record, and who serves on assignment for one (1) week on Order of the Administrative Judge of such Division.
2. Emergency assignment commences at eight o'clock A.M. Monday until eight o'clock A.M. the following Monday, regardless of Monday holidays.
3. This Order shall not alter or amend prior Administrative Orders heretofore entered by this Office that relates to weekend duty assignment of Judges holding bond, jail arraignments or Juvenile Detention hearings on the weekend.
4. These assignments pertain only to those Judges assigned to the Family Juvenile Department of the Family Division of the Circuit Court. This Order will be effective January 1, 1981 and replaces Administrative Order No. 79-14.
